Support the State School Improvement Strategy 2021 – 2025 ('Every student succeeding') with priority focus on wellbeing, collaboration, adjustments for students, positive transitions and continuous improvement in the access to, and teaching, learning and assessment of the Australian Curriculum.

In 2022, Eumundi State School is prioritising our 'Positive Learning' approach. Our aim is to ensure every student is ready for active, engaged and positive learning. Teaching teams, in collaboration with the Support Team, Head of Department - Curriculum and the Co-teaching Team, will tailor explicit teaching in response to their student Positive Learning survey data, attendance data and A-E English results to monitor engagement across the school of all students, document quality adjustments for individual students in their Personal Learning Plans and a review of our curriculum delivery approach.

Our targets -

- 100% students at or above NAPLAN National Minimum Standard (NMS) Writing. 100% students know their individual writing goal.
- 100% of students with identified needs have a Personalised Learning Plan documented with strategies reflective of daily teaching practices.
- 100% teachers respond to a domain or indicator from their class' Positive Learning Surveys

Our initiatives include

'Positive Learning' focuses on achieving a balance of physical health, mental health, social/emotional health and academic health in order to maximise our students' capacity for optimal learning. The Eumundi State School Positive Learning approach is strengthened by relationships, empowerment, resilience, and gratitude. These values enhance our daily ways of learning and our overall health and wellbeing, and help ensure we are 'Ready for learning and ready for life'. Our program is underpinned by positive psychology in education and neuroscientific principles for promoting learning.

Our strategic initiatives include:

- Whole school curriculum review integrated units (Australian Curriculum) focusing on
 engaging curriculum and celebrations of learning for school community; co-constructed with
 teaching teams and HOC during TOPS days. This initiative allows for the continuous
 improvement in the manner in which the Australian Curriculum is delivered and assessed in order
 to engage our students and ultimately enhance achievement levels. The review is also in
 response to SOS data and student Positive Learning survey data identifying this as an aspect of
 the 'right work' for our school.
- Positive schools and positive psychology professional development
 - o aligned to APDP process and tailored to individual staff needs
 - establish Wellbeing Hub with teaching and learning resources
 - o engage parents in workshops of positive learning information sessions
- Engage Year Level Coordinator Team with regular structured meetings and capability/leadership focus.





- Ongoing Case Management Process (writing) and co-teaching cycle with class teachers and Co-teaching Team. Through this approach the school will transition from an improvement focus on reading, to writing. This initiative will include whole school writing professional development and co-teaching approaches facilitating best practice in the teaching of writing and the implementation of high yield strategies across all classrooms in our school.
- Strategic engagement Early Years providers and network; Eumundi State School transition to Prep Program.
- Cluster collaboration moderation (English), Early Years and Middle Leaders network.
